- This will be a mega –global event, which will be taking place in over 100 countries.
- School students shall assemble solar lamps in SLIET Longowal campus on 2nd Oct. 2019
- One lamp kits cost Rs. 510/- and is procured through sponsorship and is free for student
- Students will be guided by SLIET volunteer students in assembling the different parts of the lamp.
- The children can then take away and use the lamp assembled by him or her.
- More than 100 students are participating at SLIET Longowal
- The school principal can nominate 5-10 students of IX-XII standard students for participation
- The participating students will receive a certificate from SoULS, Initiative IIT Bombay
- Refreshment/lunch will be served to participating students & teachers on 2nd October 2019
- All participating students are required to report at 9:30 AM, Science Block, SLIET Longowal
